Introduction to Dependent Forums

Put a full message forum on your website!

When you use Dependent Forums, your visitors can register to become a member of your forum to join in on the discussions within your forum topics. They can post photos by inserting HTML code in their messages linking to photos from other websites, each user can choose an avatar image to assign to their profile so when posting messages a specific avatar image will be next to their messages, for the owner of the forum, the system is setup to be user friendly to quickly be able to go in and change the colors of the forum, upload new icons and avatars, as well as maintaining the system's users, security categories, topics, and postings.



Easy To Setup:

- Easy to implement
- Drop the DF directory on your windows based hosting account and start using.
- Pure ASP Source code so you can redesign the forum to the way you want.
- The system is run off of an MS Access Database, so it's very portable and easy to backup.

System Requirements:

- Windows 2003 Server, IIS 5.0, ASP Enabled with the directory set to Read/Write access.
- Requires CDO Protocol Enabled for Admin email notifications (Optional).

Installing & Setting Up Dependent Forums

This area will guide you step by step on installing your forum and setting it up.

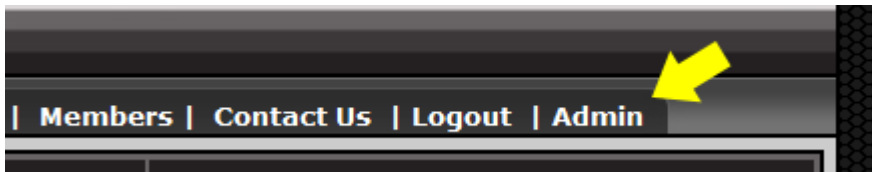
Installing Dependent Forums

- **Step 1:** Move the DF folder with all files inside to your hosting account using a normal FTP program.
- **Step 2:** open up your web browser and go to www.yourname.com/DF to launch the forum.

Once the forum loads up enter in:

Username: admin
Password: admin

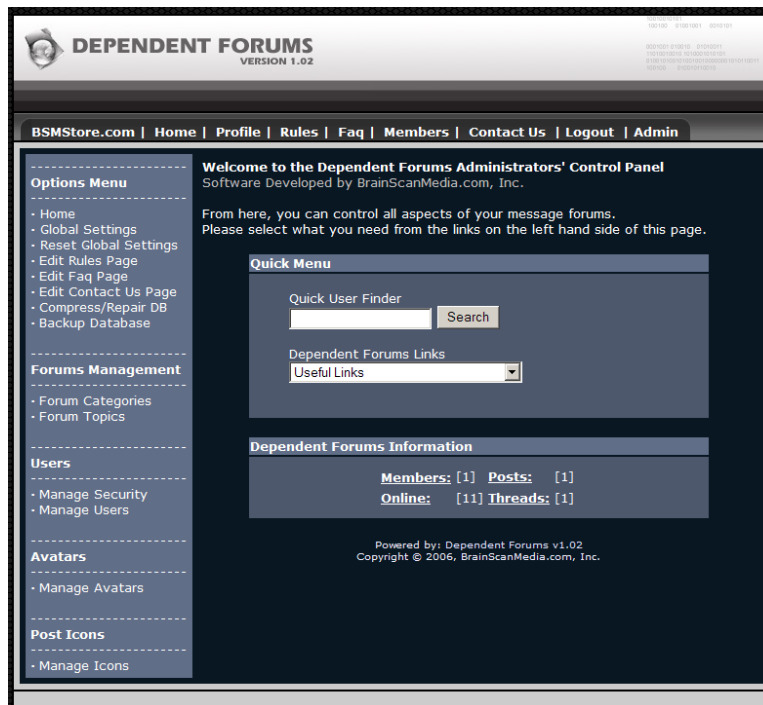
You will notice a new menu option appears



- **Step 3:** Click on Admin to enter in the forums admin area where you will be able to edit the forum to your own.

Security Notice: Make sure you also click on Profile while you are logged in as admin and change the password. Do not leave the password as the default or then anyone can get in to your forum and make a real mess.

- **Step 4:** Once you enter the admin area you will see many menu options. Here is where you can update everything the form has to offer.



- **Step 5:** First we will start by editing the global information! Click on Global Settings to enter the area.

Forum Information

Forum Title

From here you will update the Forum Title to your own forum name, Example: Robs Game Talk!

Welcome Text - The Welcome text which is the text everyone will see when they load up your forum. You can say Welcome or any slogan you like.

Forum Width Size

Forum Width – This is the size of the forum, by default it is set to 777 width, or you can change it to 100% to stretch across the screen.

Link to a Main Website on Forum Nav (Ex: My Website)

Home / Main URL Name – This area is where you can enter a name or your website so when visitors are done with your forum they can click on this button name to go back to your normal website. By entering text here a new menu option will appear in from of home that can be the link to your website.

Home / Main URL Address – This is where you will put the full web URL to assign to the name above. When the name listed above is clicked on it will take the visitor to the URL you list in this area.

POP3 Mail Information

Default Email Address – Enter in your email address so when the forum sends emails it will list that the email is from this address.

POP3 Mail Server – Enter your POP3 Mail Server address here so the forum can connect to send out emails using CDO.

POP3 Mail User Name – User name of your POP3 Account, most of the times it's your full email address.

POP3 Mail Password – Password to your POP3 account so the forum has access to send the emails.

Notify Me Of New Postings – Select Yes to be notified of all new postings. An email will be sent with a direct link to the posting.

Notify Me Of New Members – Select Yes if you would like to receive an email of all new users who join your forum.

Auto Accept All New Members – Select Yes is you want to allow all new registrants to be able to post to your forum once registration is complete. If you select No then you will be required to enable their account with a special security setting after they have joined.

Notify Email Address – This will be the email address where all your email notifications will go to.

Images

Header Image – Here is where you can enter the name of your header image. You can easily upload a new header image to your DF/images directory then enter the file name in this area. From then on your new header image will appear on every page.

Category Image – This is the image that will appear on the main page where the category name is listed. This image is 161x34 Pixels and you can upload your own image and point to that image from this area.

Body Background Image – This is where you can point the entire forum background to load up your own background image.

Menu Navigation Image Color – This dropdown is set with a number of pre-made colored menu bars. If you have a red, blue, yellow tone to your forum you can select the color here so your menu matches your color theme.

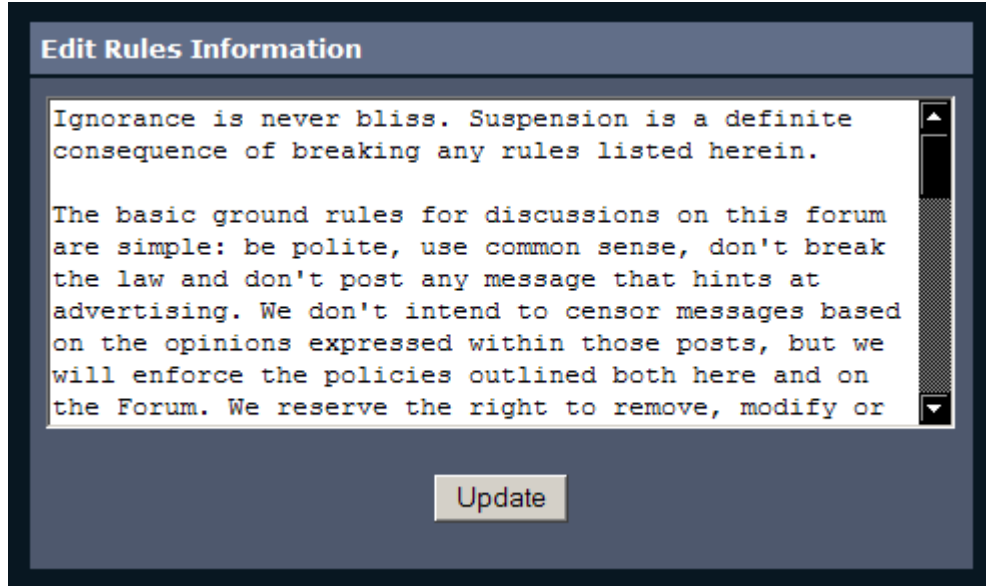
Forum Style & Colors

- **Step 6:** The next step will be to edit your Rules, Faq, and Contact Us page.

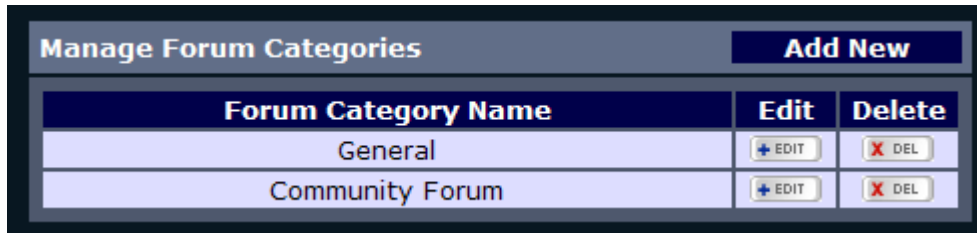

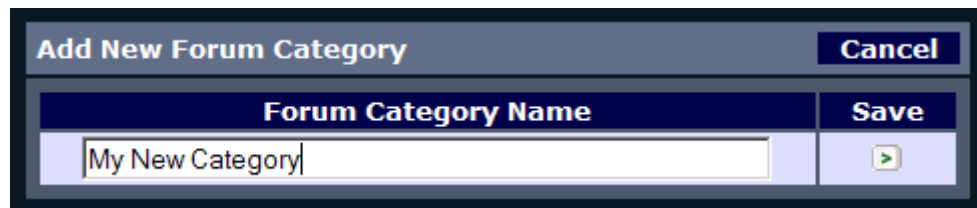
Once you have done this we can go on to Step 7. There is also no need to enter in html
 tags for line breaks, the system converts line breaks automatically in the background.

- **Step 7:** Forums Management

Now we need to setup your actual Topic Categories and Topics. Let's start by clicking on Forum Categories!













You will see two categories are already setup. You can click Add New to add a new Category to your forum, please keep in mind that if you delete a category all topics and messages linked to the category will be removed. Ok let's click on Add New!



You will notice an area where you can type in your new category name. Once done, click the green arrow to add this new category to your forum.

- **Step 8:** Next we will need to create the topics for these categories, so let's click on Forum Topics! You will notice some default topics from our forum, you can delete them and add your own.

As you will see its setup just like the categories area, except this allows you to create the actual forum areas to post messages to. In this area you also have the option to set the security for each topic, lets take a look, Click Add New!

As you will see you have a few options to set. First you will choose the category this topic will appear under by selecting the category from the first dropdown list. Next you will type in the name of the Topic, example: Game Talk Central or Game Cheats. You can then add a description to appear under the topic, example: Where you can post all your game cheats and strategies. After that you can set the security. Open Forum is set so anyone can post to the topic, Read only is so only the Moderator or Admin so to speak can post news and info without having others post to your topic. Next is Members only. This option is so you can set the Topic to be accessible by a special security setting like Members or one of your own Security options that you can set in the Manage Users area. The Password required option is if you just want to be prompted for a password in order to enter in this area to post. Filly the last security option is No Access. This is if you want to keep the topic in the forum but have it closed so no one can enter it except the Moderator.

Now that we have gone through the basic Installation & Setup we can go on to the rest of the Admin options that are available.

Exploring the Rest of the Administration Area

Resetting Your Global Settings

If you need to reset your forum Global Settings to the Default settings just click the Reset Global Settings option for everything to revert back to pre-installed global setting.

Compress/Repair DB

If you do a lot of deleting or your user base is pretty big and you notice the forum is running a little slow, you can click this option to compress and removed any past deleted topics and messages from the system. This will then make things run faster.

Backup Database

If you want to do a daily backup of your forum database you can click this option to download your entire database to your computer. This is another reason we love using access for this type of thing, it's very easy to backup.

Users: Manage Security

If you want to setup your own special security for topics this is the place to do it.

By default the security area already has four groups setup. You will be able to add your own security groups to assign to members or use the basic that are included. You will be able to edit the members group but will not be able to edit or delete Moderator, Guest, and Inactive since these groups are required to make the forum work correctly. If you want to ban a member from posting with their account, just set them to inactive in the Manage Users area.

Users: Manage Users

If you want to change a user's security or remove their account all together, then this is the area in which this can be done. Deleting a user will not delete their past postings, as long as you are signed in as Moderator, you will be able to go through the forum and delete the postings.

Avatars: Manage Avatars

Avatars are small pictures that appear next to or underneath your members' names on their posts etc. Using the Avatar Manager, you can pre-define groups of avatars from which your members can choose one as their own avatar. If you want to upload or delete avatars in your system you have a very simple interface to complete this task.

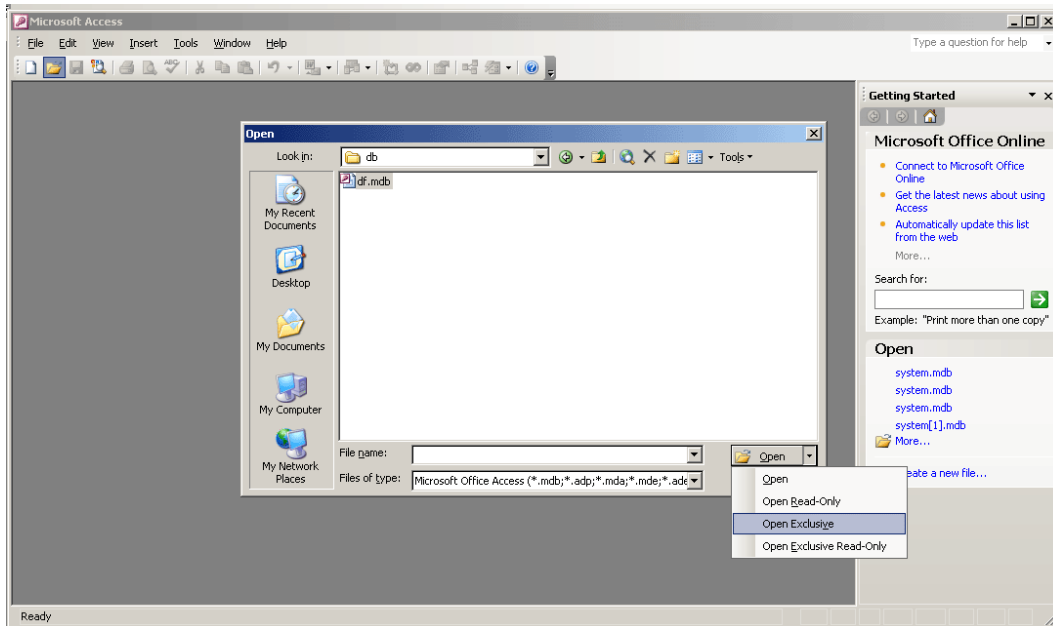
Database Security

A step-by-step guide to protecting your database...

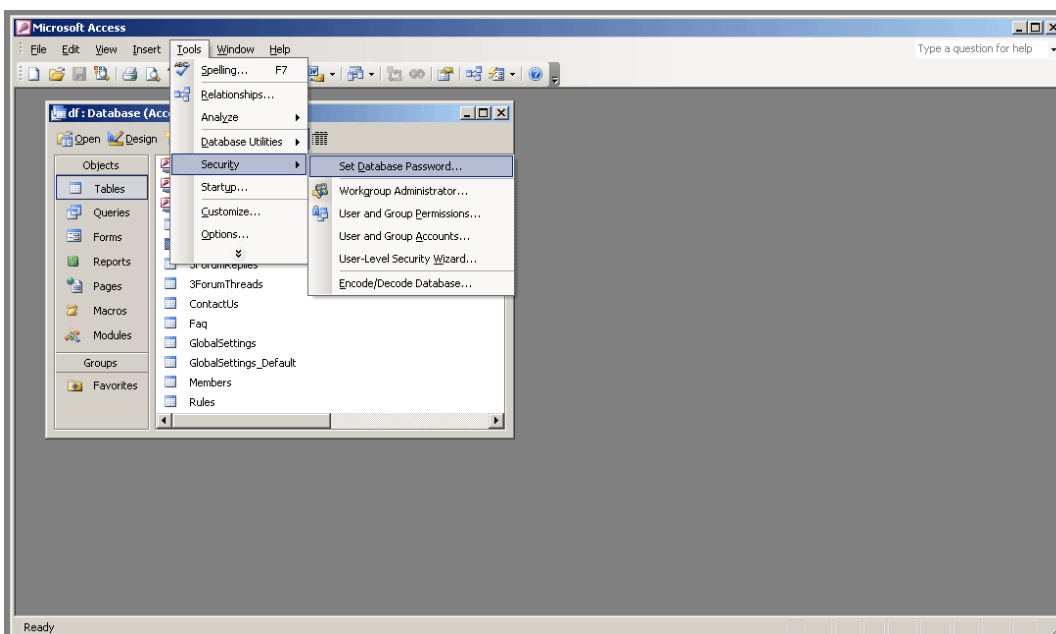
With your forum come's people who would try to abuse your forum. We will walk you through on setting up your database to be secured.

Password Protecting Your Database!

Start MS Access, then choose File / Open and select the db/df.mdb. From there before hitting open choose the arrow next to the open button and choose Open Exclusive.



The df.mdb will be open in Exclusive Mode to allow you to set a password. From there, click on Tools / Security / Set Database Password and enter your new password.



Once you set your password you must also put the new password in the forum INI files. To do this go to your DF directory and using notepad open up the _ini.asp and the _ini_default.asp files. From there you will enter in the new database password on this line:

```
Const DB_PASSWORD = "your password here"
```

Save the files and re-upload them to your online forum in the DF directory. Also do not forget to re-upload your database to the DF/db directory now that a password is set to it. Now if anyone tries to download your database it will require a password to open it.

Secure Your Database By Moving It To A New Location!

Some of you may also want to move the database to a new directory or an outside directory from your root directory. Example: Let's say you upload all your files to a wwwroot directory but outside that directory your hosting company has a directory called db! This is where you can store your database so no one can download it and only the ASP scripts has access to this outside directory on the server side.

In order for us to do this we need to move the database df.mdb to its new location. Now open up the _ini.asp and the _ini_default.asp files and edit the DBLocation = "db/df.mdb" string to the new location.

In most cases if you have it setup outside your root directory it would look something like this

```
DBLocation = "../db/df.mdb"
```

You can also rename the database too for extra security. but make sure to update the two ini files with this change.

Trouble Shooting the Dependent Forums

If you happen to come across some issues while using Dependent Forums, please read this area before contacting technical support.

Trouble Shooting Images & Email Settings

Question: Some of the avatar images or icon images come up and I get an X where they are supposed to be shown!

Answer: Make sure that the image formats are GIF, JPG, or BMP formats.

Question: I do not get any email notifications when new members or topics are posted.

Answer 1: Make sure you have setup the Mail Server Address, User Name, & Password correctly. Also make sure that your hosting company allows you to send CDO email messages from ASP scripts. CDO messages sends mail using a basic SMTP setting that logs directly into a POP3 account to send the email. If you get an error saying trouble connecting to mail server, then you will need to make sure your mail account settings are setup correctly.

Answer 2: Another instance is if you just switched your domain to a new hosting account, it takes up to 24 hours for your DNS information to propagate throughout the entire Net.

Trouble Shooting the Database

Question: When I try to post a new topic or update the system from the administration on the Dependent Forums, I get this error:

Microsoft OLE DB Provider for ODBC Drivers error '80004005'
[Microsoft][ODBC Microsoft Access Driver] Cannot update. Database or object is read-only.

Answer: You are getting this error because the forum software is trying to write to the database to either save or update information from the admin or posting new messages and topics and has detected that the database file is set to read only. To solve this issue have your web hosting company or you login to your hosting control panel that some hosting companies give access to and enable the entire directory to Read & Write status, or just that file if you prefer. Most times by default the hosting companies has the directory where your website is held is set to read only, but to do simple tasks like write to an access database or even update a text file that acts as your website counter, you will need to have the files or the entire directory set to Read / Write status instead of read only. Its best to set the entire directory incase later you update a file or move things around you will not need to enable the Write status for every file each time you update it.

Question: When I run the Dependent Forums I get this error:

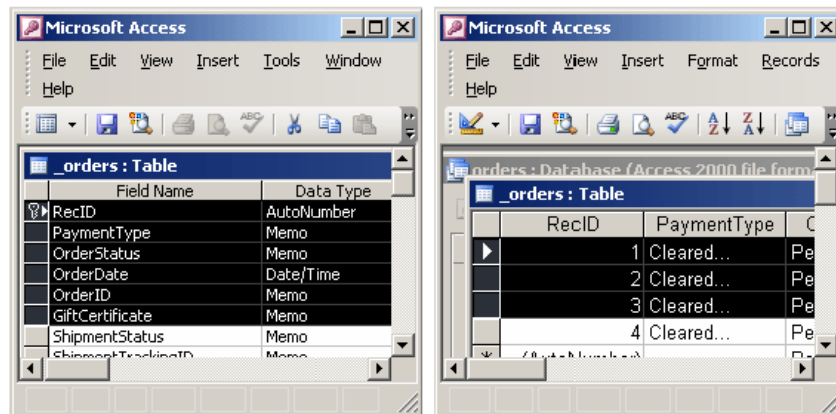
Provider error '80004005' Unspecified error.

Answer: You are getting this error because the forum software is having problems connecting to the database. This can be one of two things! You may have set a password to your database and the password in the Dependent Forums INI files does not match. If this is not the case open up the access database and make sure it is not corrupted. Sometimes if a server is configured wrong or moving files around while users are using the system it can mess up your database when writing to it. This is a rare occurrence, but it does happen with those hosting companies that are constantly moving files around on their customers. There was one instance where someone setup their FTP software to send as ASCII Format instead of Binary to upload the database and website content, and it messed up everything. The database was corrupted from the ASCII upload. So when the forum tried to save data to the database, it would not connect due to this reason.

Question: When I run the Dependent Forums I get the following error:

[Microsoft][ODBC Microsoft Access Driver]General error Unable to open registry key 'Temporary (volatile) Jet DSN for process 0x2364 Thread 0x6b80 DBC 0x1bba984 Jet'.

Answer: This error is due to the database' registry key. In some instances if a server has crashed or an error accrued when the database is doing some tasks the key may be erased. No worries since it's only the indexing key assigned to the Auto Numbering field that puts in the Auto number for the Record being created. No data is lost from this. If you do run into this problem which is very rare, you can do one of two things. One, you can backup the original database with all the postings to a backup directory and upload the original database that came with the Dependent Forums package, this will take care of the issue. Two, you can repair the original database by opening the database and creating a new table, for demo purposes we will show you an repair on a store database, lets call it _orders1 and open the original table _orders and click to view it in design mode. From there copy all the field names and past it in the design view of the _orders1 table. Once the fields are matched you can now copy all the records from the original _orders table and past it in the new _orders1 table. Now all your records have been put in with a working registry key. From there you can delete the original _orders table and rename the new table _orders1 to _orders. Before closing the database completely, we will need to clean and compress the database by clicking on Tools / Database Utilities / Compact and Repair Database. This will repair your database and remove the deleted table and data from the database and compress the database to run faster. Again we are showing you this technique using a store database with the forum database some area use the auto numbering field to link to certain messages so if you redo the numbering it may lose its connection with some messages or mix them up. So make sure you know how to repair access databases before trying this. We would just recommend you backup your database daily incase you need to replace t with your backup.



Upgrading Dependent Forums

From time to time it will be necessary to upgrade your Dependent Forums installation to the latest version, either to gain new features or to fix newly discovered bugs in ASP, MS Access or Dependent Forums itself.

When upgrading to a new version all you will need to do is overwrite the outdated files in the DF directory with the new files released. Most of the updates will not need to touch your database file. But we strongly recommend that you back up your database prior to any upgrade.

Setting Up CDO on Your Server

As far as setting up CDO on your Windows 2003 server, there is really no setup necessary since it's installed automatically on Windows 2003 Server when you install the IIS application. If you do get errors open up IIS and right-click on the site and choose permissions. From there you can allow what needs to be allowed to run your site properly. From there your set and your forum will use CDO to send out the emails.
